DID YOU Know?

Gateway Home is a comfort-care private home that welcomes residents to live out the last chapter of life in a safe, caring, and comforting environment.

We work with nursing agencies such as Hospice and VNA to execute medical orders provided to us on how to care for our residents during their end-of-life journey.

Representatives from these agencies visit Gateway Home about once a week to review the care plans, make changes as needed, and answer any questions that the Gateway Home nursing staff or trained volunteers may have as it relates to the resident's care.

Gateway Home is a not-for-profit 501C(3) organization that does not charge for any of

the services provided, nor does it take any federal or state aid (i.e.



Medicaid / Medicare / Insurance). Operational costs equate to approximately \$225,000 annually. Funding is solely accomplished through

volunteer efforts, donations, bequests, and community support.

Admission is based solely on need and Gateway Home has a working relationship with regional hospice offices, hospitals, and nursing homes that assist families and residents in transitioning to a comfort care facility such as Gateway Home.

The day before my sister, Jammie, came to Gateway Home last summer I spent the entire day with her at the hospital.

We talked about things sisters talked about - family, our relationships, our wishes, disappointments, and what came after this life. This day was vastly different than the previous six weeks since her cancer diagnosis, which were filled with doctors, testing, hospitals, and insurance companies. My family and I were her medical advocates when she couldn't do it for herself. As much as we wanted to bring her home when it became clear her cancer was terminal, we knew we could not care for her. Jammie did not want to die in the hospital.

We are so incredibly thankful she was accepted into the beautiful Gateway Home. From the very beginning, the staff listened to Jammie, and my family, down to the smallest details. Jammie talked about dreams of going to Jamaica. When she arrived, her room was decorated with the Jamaican flag and photos of beaches. It was perfect. We knew that all of Jammie's wants and needs were being met, which allowed us to just be her family. To sit with her and laugh, listen to Bob Marley, and reminisce. My dad brought his new puppy to visit.

The staff and volunteers took the time to explain things to Jammie and to us, reassuring us at such a scary time. Jammie spent just five days at Gateway Home before her death, but these were days she spent with her family and her friends, in a peaceful environment surrounded by love.

Gateway Home is a gift to the WNY community, and we will forever be grateful it was there for Jammie and our family.

Outdoor Enhancement:


Thanks to grant funding we have received from the East Hill Foundation, Gateway Home is adding a new brick walkway to our back-yard area, and replacing the existing walkway in front of our Home. As part of this project, we're creating a new opportunity

to raise funds for our comfort care operations by letting our donors honor a loved one, or show that they themselves, their family, their business, or their organization supports Gateway Home.
